Strategic Direction

Through governing, growing and safeguarding the cultural and commercial assets returned to us through our Treaty Settlement, and through representing the collective interests of Ngā Maunga Whakahii ki Kaipara, we advance the capability, opportunities and aspirations of our whānau, marae and hapū.

1. Pou Tuatahi: Whānau, Marae, Hapū

we oversee the work of the subsidiary boards to ensure our whānau, marae, and hapū are empowered to lead their own development and thrive culturally, socially, and economically.

2. Pou Tuarua: Represent

we advocate for the collective voice of whānau, marae and hapū within local and central government, and national fora.

we build organisational maturity and operational excellence to support whānau, marae, and hapū aspirations.

Consent Conditions

What we Strengthen in the Conditions

Relationship & Oversight

- Power to directly influence over the construction and management plans
- Capacity to commission independent expert advice, rather than relying solely on Waste Management or Council reports
- Apply tikanga-led oversight, not just Western environmental monitoring
- Enabling mechanisms for public reporting to increase transparency

Relationship Agreement

What we Achieved in a Relationship Agreement

Collective Action for the Hōteio and Kaipara

- Centering hapū-led restoration and research
- Waste minimisation investment
- Removal of tons of waste from closed landfills around the Kaipara
- Recovery of 6 years of court costs

Leachate Assurances

What we Achieved in a Relationship Agreement & Conditions

Bottom-line Leachate Assurances

Waste Management must do everything possible to ensure no leachate ever reaches groundwater or the Hōteio Awa and Kaipara.

- 80% waste stoppage, particularly targeting construction waste
- Clauses that can put a complete halt on landfill operation
- Agreements that creates long-term accountability

Financial Backstop

Financial Backstop

An environmental bond accessible by tangata whenua is rare and potent. It creates:

- An independent pool of funds for remediation
- A back-up plan if both WMNZ and Council fail to act
- A restorative justice mechanism

**This bond is not held by tangata whenua*

Exercising Stewardship

Agreements & Strengthen Conditions

Strong mitigation clauses and agreements shift power back to tangata whenua, through public accountability, bonding mechanisms, and restoration leadership.

Legally **proactive and aware**

Financially strategic only for **environmental gains**

Culturally grounded and **inclusive**

High Court Update

- 13 July 2025 - Discontinuance request issued
- 8 August 2025 - Response confirmed no agreeance
- 21 August 2025 - Memo filed in High Court seeking JC
- 1 September 2025 - Confirmed Hearing

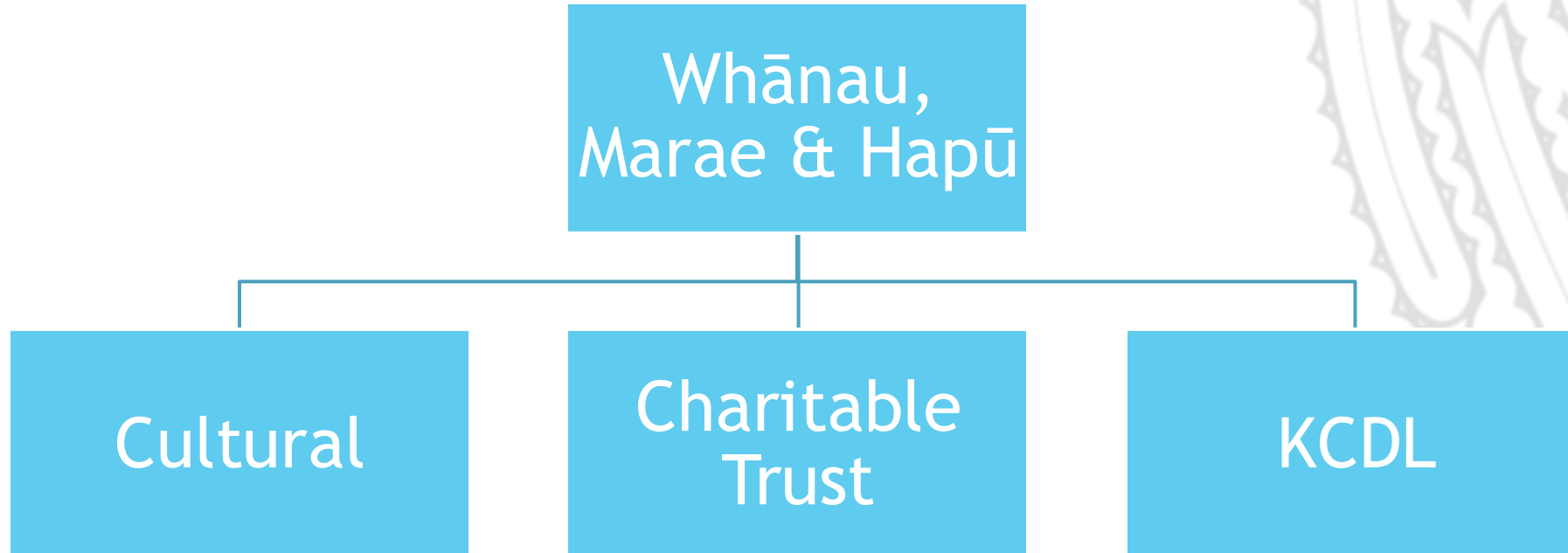

The mauri of Kaipara Harbour is restored and protected and it's significance for Kaipara Uri and all New Zealanders is recognised.

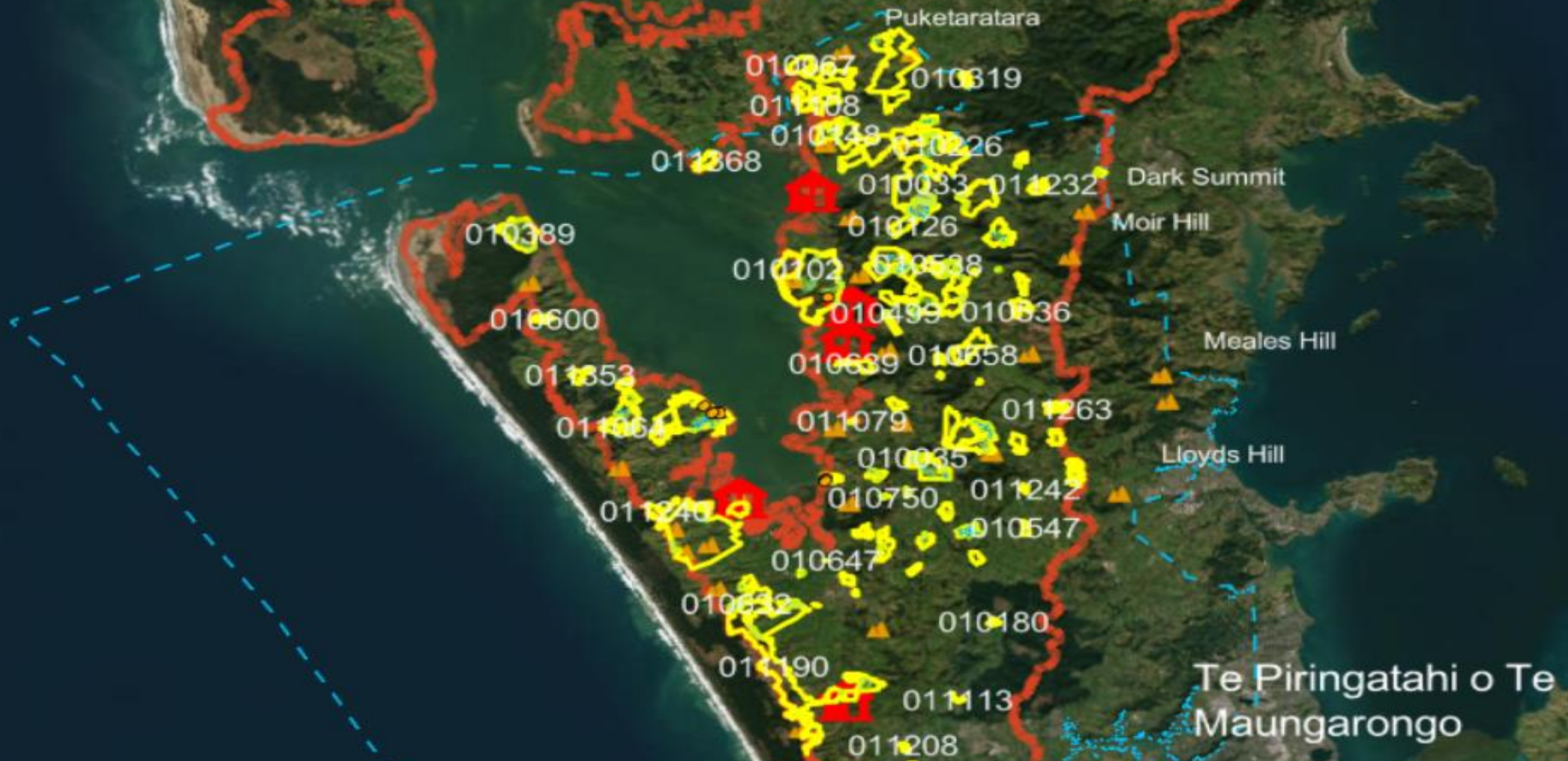
